## 7. Reports on

i) **Developments with the New Community Building.** Sue Rodgers explained that this project came out of the 2006 plan. 80%+ wanted to have a new building. A project manager has taken on the job and is working pro bono for much of the time. The project

would be built in three parts. Phase one, the tallest piece at the back, phase two, the café and social part, phase three, the day centre and space for toddlers. Here followed a general discussion.

- **ii) Library.** Ceri reported that the library is well used and we are continuing to gain more borrowers. She thanked the volunteers without whom it couldn't run. 3<sup>rd</sup> birthday party morning is Sat July 7th. Alan added details of current projects and Brian thanked the Committee. We are the 2<sup>nd</sup> most used Community library in the County.
- **iii) Barrow Voice.** Gaynor did a quick run through the last half a dozen issues. 2016 saw a change in format. Effort is made to cover everything in the village.
- iv) Events. Val said there had been 4 dances and 4 Centre Stage productions. They had also catered for the Murder Mystery.
- v) Heritage. Kathryn reported that the group are currently looking through the log books for Cotes Road School and what was Church School at Hall Orchard. They are also exploring the 1939 register for the village.
- **vi) Panto.** Last year the youth theatre production Robin and the Sherwood Hoodies was successful. The panto Dick Whittington was well attended. Both shows made a profit as did the murder mystery. The youth theatre won best in county at the Pantomime Alliance Awards. Next Nov youth theatre will perform Hairspray and in March panto will be Beauty and the Beast.
- vii) Twinning. Ted said there is a regular bi-annual exchange. This year 34 people are going to France at the end of May.
- viii) Website administrators. Keith reported that there were 31,000 viewings of the village website last month. Nicola has taken over the admin of BUSCA's social media (ie Facebook) and also keeping the BUSCA website up to date with what's going on.
- 10. Any Other Business: i) Taylors flowers have offered to sell tickets for events in the village.
- ii) Brief report on endeavours of trustees to achieve sustainability: we will shortly be trying to find a secretary and a membership secretary. Judith is writing a Role booklet to identify detailed procedures that she is currently operating so that it can be shared. She is also making progress on finding a new advertising manager for Barrow Voice and various roles with Panto and Youth Theatre.
